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POLICY STATEMENT

Section 23.1, 23.23 Objectives/Policy Statement

The City of McAllen, Texas, and McAllen International Airport (MFE)) has established an Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) program in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), 49 CFR part 23. **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** is a primary airport and has received federal funds authorized for airport development after January 1988 (authorized under Title 49 of the United States Code). McAllen International Airport (MFE) has signed airport grant assurances that it will comply with 49 CFR part 23.

It is the policy of McAllen International Airport (MFE) to ensure that ACDBEs as defined in part 23 have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in concession opportunities. It is also our policy:

- 1. To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of opportunities for concessions by airports receiving DOT financial assistance;
- 2. To create a level playing field on which ACDBEs can compete fairly for opportunities for concessions;
- 3. To ensure that our ACDBE program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law:
- 4. To ensure that only firms that fully meet this part's eligibility standards are permitted to participate as ACDBEs;
- 5. To help remove barriers to the participation of ACDBEs in opportunities for concessions our airport(s):
- 6. To promote the use of ACDBEs in all types of concessions activities at our airport(s);
- 7. To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside the ACDBE program; and
- 8. To provide appropriate flexibility to airports receiving DOT financial assistance in establishing and providing opportunities for ACDBEs.

Estela Velasquez has been designated as the ACDBE Liaison Officer (ACDBELO). In that capacity, **Estela Velasquez** is responsible for implementing all aspects of the ACDBE program. Implementation of the ACDBE program is accorded the same priority as compliance with all other legal obligations incurred by the McAllen International Airport (MFE) in its financial assistance agreements with the Department of Transportation. McAllen International Airport (MFE) has disseminated this policy statement to the City of McAllen, Texas, and all of the components of our organization. We have distributed this statement to ACDBE and non-ACDBE concessionaire communities in our area. The distribution was accomplished by electronic transmission.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Section 23.1 Objectives

The objectives are found in the policy statement on the first page of this program.

Section 23.3 Definitions

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will use terms in this program that have the meaning defined in Section 23.3 and part 26 Section 26.5 where applicable.

Section 23.5 Applicability

McAllen International Airport (MFE) is a primary airport, and the sponsor of federal airport funds authorized for airport development after January 1988 that was authorized under Title 49 of the United States Code.

Section 23.9 Non-discrimination Requirements

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will never exclude any person from participation in, deny any person the benefits of, or otherwise discriminate against anyone in connection with the award and performance of any concession agreement, management contract or subcontract, purchase or lease agreement or other agreement covered by 49 CFR part 23 on the basis of race, color, sex, or national origin.

In administering its ACDBE program, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not, directly or through contractual or other arrangements, use criteria or methods of administration that have the effect of defeating or substantially impairing accomplishment of the objectives of the ACDBE program with respect to individuals of a particular race, color, sex, or national origin.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will include the following assurances in all concession agreements and management contracts it executes with any firm:

"This agreement is subject to the requirements of the U.S. Department of Transportation's regulations, 49 CFR part 23. The concessionaire or contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against any business owner because of the owner's race, color, national origin, or sex in connection with the award or performance of any concession agreement, management contract, or subcontract, purchase or lease agreement, or other agreement covered by 49 CFR part 23.

The concessionaire or contractor agrees to include the above statements in any subsequent concession agreement or contract covered by 49 CFR part 23, that it enters and cause those businesses to similarly include the statements in further agreements."

Section 23.11 Compliance and Enforcement

McAllen International Airport (MFE) acknowledges that the compliance and enforcement provisions of 49 CFR part 26 (§§ 26.101 and 26.105 through 26.109) apply to the concessions program under Part 23 in the same way that they apply to FAA recipients and programs under Part 26.

ACDBE PROGRAM

Section 23.21 ACDBE Program Updates

McAllen International Airport (MFE) is the operator of at least one primary airport and is required to have an ACDBE program. This ACDBE program is applicable to the following airport(s):

McAllen International Airport (MFE)

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will submit a goal methodology for the primary airport. Prior to implementing significant changes to this ACDBE program, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will provide the amended program to FAA for review and approval.

Section 23.23 Administrative Provisions

Policy Statement: McAllen International Airport (MFE) is committed to operating its ACDBE program in a nondiscriminatory manner. The Policy Statement is elaborated on the first page of this program.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will thoroughly investigate, on an annual basis, the full extent of services offered by financial institutions owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals in the community and make reasonable efforts to use these institutions. **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will also encourage prime concessionaires to use such institutions.

In that capacity, the ACDBELO is responsible for implementing all aspects of the ACDBE program and ensuring that **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** complies with all provisions of 49 CFR part 23. The ACDBELO has direct, independent access to **Jeremy Santoscoy** concerning

ACDBE program matters. An organizational chart displaying the ACDBELO's position in the organization is found in Attachment 1 to this program.

The ACDBELO is responsible for developing, implementing, and monitoring the ACDBE program, in coordination with other appropriate officials. **The ACDBELO has one staff member to assist in the administration of the program.** The duties and responsibilities include the following:

- 1. Gathers and reports statistical data and other information as required by FAA or DOT.
- 2. Reviews third party contracts and purchase requisitions for compliance with this program.
- 3. Works with all departments to set overall annual goals.
- 4. Ensures that bid notices and requests for proposals are available to ACDBEs in a timely manner.
- 5. Identifies contracts and procurements so that ACDBE goals are included in solicitations (both race-neutral methods and contract specific goals)
- 6. Analyzes MFE's progress toward attainment and identifies ways to improve progress.
- 7. participates in pre-bid meetings.
- 8. Advises the Director of Aviation on ACDBE matters and achievement.
- 9. Provides ACDBEs with information and assistance in preparing bids, obtaining bonding, financing, and insurance; acts as a liaison to the OSDBU-Minority Resource Center (MRC).
- 10. Participates in FAA ACDBE training seminars when available.
- 11. Acts as liaison to the Unified Certification Program (UCP) in the State of Texas.
- 12. Provides outreach to ACDBEs and community organizations to advise them of opportunities.

Directory: Texas Unified Certification Program (TUCP) maintains a directory identifying all firms eligible to participate as DBEs and ACDBEs. The Directory lists the firm's name, address, phone number, date of the most recent certification, and the type of work the firm has been certified to perform as an ACDBE. The Directory clearly specifies whether a firm is certified as a DBE for purposes of part 26, an ACDBE for purposes of part 23, or both.

Section 23.25 Ensuring Nondiscriminatory Participation of ACDBEs

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not use set-asides or quotas as a means of obtaining ACDBE participation.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will seek ACDBE participation in all types of concession activities.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will maximize the use of race-neutral measures, obtaining as much as possible of the ACDBE participation needed to meet overall goals through such measures. **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will take the following measures to ensure

nondiscriminatory participation of ACDBEs in concessions, and other covered activities (23.25(a)):

Race-neutral measures may include but are not limited to:

- 1) Locating and identifying ACDBEs and other small businesses who may be interested in participating as concessionaires under this part;
- 2) Notifying ACDBEs of concession opportunities and encouraging them to compete, when appropriate;
- 3) When practical, structuring concession activities to encourage and facilitate the participation of ACDBEs;
- 4) Providing technical assistance to ACDBEs in overcoming limitations, such as inability to obtain bonding or financing;
- 5) Ensuring that competitors for concession opportunities are informed during pre-solicitation meetings about how the McAllen International Airport (MFE)'s ACDBE program will affect the procurement process;
- 6) Providing information concerning the availability of ACDBE firms to competitors to assist them in obtaining ACDBE participation; and
- 7) Establishing a business development program

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will also provide for the use of race-conscious measures when race-neutral measures, standing alone, are not projected to be sufficient to meet an overall goal. The following are examples of race-conscious measures we will implement, as needed:

- 1. Establishing concession-specific goals for particular concession opportunities.
 - a. In setting concession-specific goals for concession opportunities other than car rental, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will explore, to the maximum extent practicable, all available options to set goals that concessionaires can meet through direct ownership arrangements. A concession-specific goal for any concession other than car rental may be based on purchases or leases of goods and services only when the analysis of the relative availability of ACDBEs and all relevant evidence reasonably supports that there is de minimis availability for direct ownership arrangement participation for that concession opportunity.
 - b. In setting car rental concession-specific goals, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not require a car rental company to change its corporate structure to provide for participation via direct ownership arrangement. When the overall goal for car rental concessions is based on purchases or leases of goods and services, MFE is not required to explore options for direct ownership arrangements prior to setting a car rental concession-specific goal based on purchases or leases of goods and services.
 - c. If the objective of the concession-specific goal is to obtain ACDBE participation through a direct ownership arrangement with an ACDBE, **McAllen**

- **International Airport (MFE)** will calculate the goal as a percentage of the total estimated annual gross receipts from the concession.
- d. If the goal applies to purchases or leases of goods and services from ACDBEs, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will calculate the goal as a percentage of the total estimated dollar value of all purchases to be made by the concessionaire.
- e. When a concession-specific goal is set, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will require competitors to make good faith efforts to meet this goal. A competitor may do so either by obtaining enough ACDBE participation to meet the goal or by documenting that it made sufficient good faith efforts to do so.
- f. The administrative procedures applicable to contract goals in part 26, § § 26.51 through 26.53. apply with respect to concession-specific goals.
- g. In setting car rental concession-specific goals, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not require a car rental company to change its corporate structure to provide for participation via direct ownership arrangement. When the overall goal for car rental concessions is based on purchases or leases of goods and services, MFE is not required to explore options for direct ownership arrangements prior to setting a car rental concession-specific goal based on purchases or leases of goods and services.
- h. If the objective of the concession-specific goal is to obtain ACDBE participation through a direct ownership arrangement with an ACDBE, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will calculate the goal as a percentage of the total estimated annual gross receipts from the concession.
- If the goal applies to purchases or leases of goods and services from ACDBEs, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will calculate the goal as a percentage of the total estimated dollar value of all purchases to be made by the concessionaire.
- j. When a concession-specific goal is set, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will require competitors to make good faith efforts to meet this goal. A competitor may do so either by obtaining enough ACDBE participation to meet the goal or by documenting that it made sufficient good faith efforts to do so.
- k. The administrative procedures applicable to contract goals in part 26, § § 26.51 through 26.53. apply with respect to concession-specific goals.
- 2. Negotiate with a potential concessionaire to include ACDBE participation, through direct ownership arrangements or measures, in the operation of the non-car rental concessions.
- 3. With the prior approval of FAA, other methods that take a competitor's ability to provide ACDBE participation into account in awarding a concession.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) requires businesses subject to car rental and non-car rental ACDBE goals at the airport to make good faith efforts to meet goals set pursuant to this section.

Section 23.26 Fostering Small Business Participation

McAllen International Airport (MFE) has created a small business element to provide for the structuring of concession opportunities to facilitate competition by small business concerns, taking all reasonable steps to eliminate obstacles to their participation, including unnecessary and unjustified bundling of concession opportunities that may preclude small business participation in solicitations.

The small business element is incorporated as Attachment 10 to this ACDBE Program. The program elements will be actively implemented to foster small business participation. **MFE** acknowledges that active use of the small business element is a requirement of the good faith implementation of this ACDBE program.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will submit an annual report on small business participation obtained through the use of this small business element. The report must be submitted in the format acceptable to the FAA based on a schedule established and posted to the agency's website, available at https://www.faa.gov/about/office_offices/acr/bus_ent_program.

Section 23.27 Reporting

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will retain sufficient basic information about our ACDBE program implementation, ACDBE certification and the award and performance of agreements and contracts to enable the FAA to determine our compliance with part 23. This data will be retained for a minimum of 3 years following the end of the concession agreement or other covered contract.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will submit an annual report on ACDBE participation to the FAA by March 1 following the end of each fiscal year. This report will be submitted in the format acceptable to the FAA and contain all of the information described in the Uniform Report of ACDBE Participation.

- McAllen International Airport (MFE) will create and maintain active participants list information and enter it into a system designated by the FAA. MFE will collect the following information about ACDBE and non-ACDBEs who seek to work on each of our concession opportunities.
 - a. Firm name;
 - b. Firm address including ZIP code;
 - c. Firm status as an ACDBE or non-ACDBE;
 - d. Race and gender information for the firm's majority owner;
 - e. NAICS code applicable to the concession contract in which the firm is seeking to perform;
 - f. Age of the firm; and
 - g. The annual gross receipts of the firm.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will collect the data from all active participants for concession opportunities by requiring the information to be submitted with their proposals or initial responses to negotiated procurements. **MFE** will enter this data in FAA's designated system no later than March 1 following the fiscal year in which the relevant concession opportunity was awarded.

MFE is not a certifying member of the state UCP.

Section 23.29 Compliance and Enforcement Procedures

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will take the following monitoring and enforcement mechanisms to ensure compliance with 49 CFR part 23.

The city of McAllen Texas will incorporate specific provisions and enforcement mechanisms into McAllen International Airport (MFE) airport leasing agreements to ensure compliance with 49 CFR Part 23. These provisions will include measures for monitoring and verifying that the work committed to Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (ACDBEs) is performed by the ACDBEs. Furthermore, McAllen International Airport (MFE) will require a written certification indicating that they have reviewed records of all contracts, leases, joint venture agreements, or other concession-related agreements at McAllen International Airport (MFE). They will also conduct on-site monitoring at the airport to ensure compliance, in conjunction with monitoring contract performance for other purposes. This approach is designed to maintain integrity and accountability in fulfilling ACDBE commitments.

- 1. **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will bring to the attention of the Department of Transportation any false, fraudulent, or dishonest conduct in connection with the program, so that DOT can take the steps (e.g., referral to the Department of Justice for criminal prosecution, referral to the DOT Inspector General, action under suspension and debarment or Program Fraud and Civil Penalties rules) provided in 49 CFR § 26.107.
- 2. We will consider similar action under our own legal authorities, including responsibility determinations in future contracts. We have listed the regulations, provisions, and contract remedies available to us in the events of non-compliance with the ACDBE regulation by a participant in our procurement activities (See Attachment 3).

CERTIFICATION AND ELIGIBILITY

Section 23.31 Certification Standards and Procedures

McAllen International Airport (MFE) is a <u>non-certifying member</u> of the Texas Unified Certification Program (TUCP) and relies upon the UCP's determinations of certification eligibility.

Texas UCP will use the certification standards of Subpart C of Part 23 to determine the eligibility of firms to participate as ACDBEs in airport concessions contracts. To be certified as an ACDBE, a firm must meet all certification eligibility standards. Certifying Texas UCP members make all certification decisions based on the facts as a whole.

The Texas UCP directory of eligible ACDBEs specifies whether a firm is certified as a DBE for purposes of part 26, an ACDBE for purposes of part 23, or both.

Section 23.33 Business Size Standards

In general, a firm will be considered as a small business eligible to be certified as an ACDBE if its gross receipts, averaged over the firm's previous five (5) fiscal years, do not exceed \$56.42 million. The following special exceptions apply to the general small business size limit:

- 1. The limit for passenger car rental companies is \$75.23 million, averaged over the firm's previous five (5) fiscal years.
- 2. The size standard for banks and other financial institutions is \$1 billion in assets.
- 3. The size standard for pay telephone companies is 1500 employees.
- 4. The size standard for new car dealers is 350 employees.

For size purposes, gross receipts (as defined in 13 CFR 121.104(a)) of affiliates are included in a manner consistent with 13 CFR 121.104(d), except in the context of joint ventures. For gross receipts attributable to joint venture partners, a firm must include in its gross receipts its proportionate share of joint venture receipts, unless the proportionate share already is accounted for in receipts reflecting transactions between the firm and its joint ventures (e.g., subcontracts from a joint venture entity to joint venture partners).

Section 23.35 Personal Net Worth Limits

The personal net worth standard used in determining eligibility for purposes of part 23 is posted online on the Departmental Office of Civil Rights' webpage, available at:

<u>https://www.transportation.gov/DBEPNW</u>. Any individual who has a PNW exceeding this amount is not a socially and economically disadvantaged individual for purposes of this part, even if the individual is a member of a group otherwise presumed to be disadvantaged.

Section 23.37 Firms Certified as DBEs

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will presume that a firm that is certified as a DBE under part 26 is eligible to participate as an ACDBE. However, before certifying such a firm, **MFE** will ensure that the disadvantaged owners of a DBE certified under part 26 are able to control the firm with respect to its activity in the concessions program.

In reviewing the Declaration of Eligibility required by § 26.83(j), **Texas (TUCP)** will ensure that the ACDBE applicant provides documentation that it meets the applicable size standard in § 23.33.

For purposes of this part, the term *prime contractor* in § 26.87(j) includes a firm holding a contract with an airport concessionaire to provide goods or services to the concessionaire or a firm holding a prime concession agreement with a recipient.

Texas (TUCP) members will use the Uniform Certification Application found in part 26 of this chapter without change. If Texas TUCP seeks to supplement the form by requesting specified additional information consistent with part 23 and part 26, the Texas TUCP will first seek written approval of the concerned Operating Administration.

Texas TUCP will require every applicant to state that it is applying for certification as an ACDBE and complete all of section 5.

Car rental companies and private terminal owners or lessees are not authorized to certify firms as ACDBEs.

GOALS, GOOD FAITH EFFORTS, AND ACCOUNTING

Section 23.41 Overall Goals

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will establish two separate overall ACDBE goals: one for car rentals and another for concessions other than car rentals. The overall goals will cover a three-year period, and the sponsor will review the goals annually to make sure the goal continues to fit the sponsor's circumstances. **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will submit any significant overall goal adjustments to the FAA.

If the average annual concession revenues for car rentals over the preceding three (3) years do not exceed \$200,000, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** is not required to develop and submit an overall goal for car rentals. Likewise, if the average annual concession revenues for concessions other than car rentals over the preceding three (3) years do not exceed \$200,000, **MFE** is not required to develop and submit an overall goal for concessions other than car rentals. **MFE** understands that "revenue" means total revenue generated by concessions, not the revenue received by the airport from concessions agreements.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) overall goals will provide for participation by all certified ACDBEs and will not be subdivided into group-specific goals.

Section 23.43 Consultation in Goal Setting

McAllen International Airport (MFE) consults with stakeholders before submitting the overall goals to the FAA. Stakeholders will include, but not be limited to, minority and women's business groups, community organizations, trade associations representing concessionaires currently located at the airport, as well as existing concessionaires themselves, and other officials or organizations which could be expected to have information concerning the availability of disadvantaged businesses, the effects of discrimination on opportunities for ACDBEs, and the sponsors efforts to increase participation of ACDBEs.

When submitting our overall goals, we will identify the stakeholders that we consulted with and provide a summary of the information obtained from the stakeholders.

The requirements of this section do not apply if no new concession opportunities will become available during the goal period. However, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will take appropriate outreach steps to encourage available ACDBEs to participate as concessionaires whenever there is a concession opportunity.

Section 23.45 Overall Goals

Overall goals will be submitted to the FAA for approval. The overall goals meeting the requirements of this subpart are due based on a schedule established by the FAA and posted on the FAA's website.

The goals must be submitted every three years based on the published schedule.

If a new concession opportunity arises at a time that falls between the normal submission dates above and the estimated average of annual gross revenues are anticipated to be \$200,000 or greater, the sponsor will submit an appropriate adjustment to our overall goal to FAA for approval no later than 90 days before issuing the solicitation for the new concession opportunity.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will establish overall goals in accordance with the 2-Step process as specified in § 23.51. After determining the total gross receipts for the concession activity, the first step is to determine the relative availability of ACDBEs in the market area, "base

figure." The second step is to examine all relevant evidence reasonably available in the sponsor's jurisdiction to determine if an adjustment to the Step 1 "base figure" is necessary so that the goal reflects as accurately as possible the ACDBE participation the sponsor would expect in the absence of discrimination. Evidence may include, but is not limited to past participation by ACDBEs, a disparity study, evidence from related fields that affect ACDBE opportunities to form, grow, and compete (such as statistical disparities in ability to get required financing, bonding, insurance; or data on employment, self-employment, education, training, and union apprenticeship).

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will also include a projection of the portions of the overall goal expected to be met through race-neutral and race-conscious measures, respectively.

If the FAA determines that **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** goals have not been correctly calculated or the justification is inadequate, the FAA may, after consulting with us, adjust the overall goal or race-conscious/race-neutral "split." In such a case, the adjusted goal is binding on **McAllen International Airport (MFE)**.

Section 23.53 Counting ACDBE Participation for Car Rental Goals

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will count ACDBE participation toward overall goals other than car rental as provided in 49 CFR 23.53.

Section 23.55 Counting ACDBE participation for Concessions Other than Car Rentals

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will count ACDBE participation toward overall goals other than car rental as provided in 49 CFR 23.55.

Section 23.57 Goal shortfall accountability.

If the awards and commitments on the Uniform Report of ACDBE participation at the end of any fiscal year are less than the overall goal applicable to that fiscal year, we will:

- Analyze in detail the reasons for the difference between the overall goal and our awards and commitments in that fiscal year;
- Establish specific steps and milestones to correct the problems we have identified in our analysis to enable us to fully meet our goal for the new fiscal year;
- As an airport not meeting the criteria of paragraph (b)(3)(i) of this section, we will
 retain analysis and corrective actions in our records for three years and make it
 available to the FAA, on request, for their review.

FAA may impose conditions as part of its approval of McAllen International Airport (MFE) analysis and corrective actions including, but not limited to, modifications to our overall goal methodology, changes in our race-conscious/race-neutral split, or the introduction of additional race-neutral or race-conscious measures.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) may be regarded as being in noncompliance with this part, and therefore subject to the remedies in § 23.11 of this part and other applicable regulations, for failing to implement our ACDBE program in good faith if any of the following things occur:

- **MFE** does not submit the analysis and corrective actions to FAA in a timely manner as required under paragraph (b)(3) of § 23.57;
- FAA disapproves the analysis or corrective actions; or
- MFE does not fully implement:
 - a. The corrective actions to which we have committed, or
 - b. Conditions that FAA has imposed following review of our analysis and corrective actions.
 - c. If information coming to the attention of FAA demonstrates that current trends make it unlikely that we, as an airport, will achieve ACDBE awards and commitments that would be necessary to allow us to meet our overall goal at the end of the fiscal year, FAA may require us to make further good faith efforts, such as modifying our race-conscious/race-neutral split or introducing additional race-neutral or race-conscious measures for the remainder of the fiscal year.

Section 23.61 Quotas or Set-asides

We will not use quotas or set-asides as a means of obtaining ACDBE participation.

OTHER PROVISIONS

Section 23.71 Existing Agreements

If permitted by the existing agreement, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will use any means authorized by part 23 to obtain a modified amount of ACDBE participation in the renewed or amended agreement.

Section 23.73 Privately-Owned or Leased Terminal Buildings

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will pass through applicable provisions of part 23 to any private terminal owner or lessee via our agreement with the owner or lessee. We will ensure that the owner or lessee complies with part 23. We will obtain from the owner or lessee the goals and other elements of the ACDBE program required under part 23.

Section 23.75 Long-Term Exclusive Agreements

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not enter into a long-term and exclusive agreements for concessions without prior approval of the FAA Regional Civil Rights Office. We understand that a "long-term" agreement is one having a term of more than 10 years, including any combination of base term and options or holdovers to extend the term of the agreement if the effect is a term of more than ten years. We understand that an exclusive agreement is one having

a type of business activity that is conducted solely by a single business entity on the entire airport, irrespective of ACDBE participation.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) may enter into a long-term, exclusive concession agreement only under the following conditions:

- 1) Special local circumstances exist that make it important to enter such agreement; and
- 2) FAA approves McAllen International Airport (MFE)'s plan for meeting the standards of paragraph (c) of § 23.75.

To obtain FAA approval of a long-term exclusive concession agreement, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will submit the following information to the FAA. The items in paragraphs (1) through (3) below will be submitted at least 60 days before the solicitation is released and items in paragraphs (4) through (7) will be submitted at least 45 days before contract award:

- 1) A description of the special local circumstances that warrant a long-term, exclusive agreement;
- 2) A copy of the solicitation;
- 3) ACDBE contract goal analysis developed in accordance with this part;
- 4) Documentation that ACDBE participants are certified in the appropriate NAICS code in order for the participation to count towards ACDBE goals;
- 5) A general description of the type of business or businesses to be operated by the ACDBE, including location and concept of the ACDBE operation;
- 6) Information on the investment required on the part of the ACDBE and any unusual management or financial arrangements between the prime concessionaire and ACDBE, if applicable;
- 7) Final long-term exclusive concession agreement, subleasing or other agreements;
 - a) In order to obtain FAA approval of a long-term exclusive concession agreement that has been awarded through direct negotiations, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will submit the items in paragraphs (1) and (3) through (7) of this section at least 45 days before contract award;
 - b) In order to obtain FAA approval of an exclusive concession agreement that becomes long-term as a result of a holdover tenancy, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will submit to the responsible FAA regional office a holdover plan for FAA approval at least 60 days prior to the expiration of the current lease term. The holdover plan shall include the following information:
 - i. A description of the special local circumstances that warrant the holdover;
 - ii. Anticipated date for renewal or re-bidding of the agreement;
 - iii. The method to be applied for renewal or re-bidding of the agreement;
 - iv. Submission of all items required under (3), (4), (6), and (7) of this section for the agreement in holdover status or an explanation as to why the item is not available or cannot be submitted.

Section 23.77 Preemption of Local Requirements

In the event that a State or local law, regulation, or policy differs from the requirements of this part, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will, as a condition of remaining eligible to receive Federal financial assistance from the DOT, take such steps as may be necessary to comply with the requirements of 49 CFR part 23. However, nothing in part 23 preempts any State or local law, regulation, or policy enacted by the governing body of **McAllen International Airport (MFE)**, or the authority of any State or local government or **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** to adopt or enforce any law, regulation, or policy relating to ACDBEs, as long as the law, regulation, or policy does not conflict with part 23.

Section 23.79 Geographic Preferences

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will not use a local geographic preference. For purposes of this section, a local geographic preference is any requirement that gives a concessionaire located in one place (e.g., our local area) an advantage over concessionaires from other places in obtaining business as, or with, a concession at our airport(s).



Active Participants List Collection Form

Per 49 CFR Part 23 § 23.27 McAllen International Airport (MFE) maintains an ACDBE active participants list information from all firms that have participated or attempted to participate in airport concession activities and submitted proposals or initial responses to negotiated procurements. This data is collected for all firms who sought to participate in the opportunity (successfully or not).

MFE typically collects the following information for the active participants list:

- Firm name
- Firm Address including ZIP code
- Firm's status as an ACDBE or non-ACDBE
- Race and gender information for the firm's majority owner
 - Use only the race/ethnicity classifications from 49 CFR part 26:
 - Black American
 - Hispanic American
 - Native American
 - Asian Pacific American
 - Subcontinent Asian American
 - Other
- NAICS code applicable to the concession contract in which the firm is seeking to perform
- Age of the firm
- Annual gross receipts of the firm. The gross receipts can be obtained by asking each firm to indicate into what gross receipts bracket they fit (e.g., less than \$1 million; \$1-3 million; \$3-6 million; \$6-10 million, etc.) rather than requesting an exact figure from the firm.]

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Sample Monitoring and Enforcement Mechanisms

McAllen International Airport (MFE) has available several remedies to enforce the DBE requirements contained in its contracts, including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Breach of contract action, pursuant to the terms of this contract
- 2. Breach of contract action, pursuant to applicable state statutes.

The **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will implement various mechanisms to monitor program participants to ensure they comply with part 23, including, but not limited to the following:

- 1. We will insert the following provisions into concessions agreements and management contracts:
 - a. Suspension or debarment proceedings pursuant to 49 CFR part 23
 - b. Enforcement action pursuant to 49 CFR part 31; and
 - c. Prosecution pursuant to 18 USC 1001
- 2. We will implement our compliance and monitoring procedures as follows:

The City has established an Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) program in accordance with the regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), 49 CFR Part 23. The Operator is required to participate in the City's ACDBE program.

- A. This Agreement is subject to the requirements of the U.S. Department of Transportation's regulations, 49 CFR Part 23. CONCESSIONAIRE agrees that it will not discriminate against any business owner because of the owner's race, color, national origin, or sex in connection with the award of performance of any concession agreement, management contract, or subcontract, purchase or lease agreement, or other agreement covered by 49 CFR Part 23.
- B. CONCESSIONAIRE agrees to include the statement set forth in paragraph B in any subsequent concession agreements or contract covered by Title 49 CFR Part 23, that it enters into and cause those businesses to similarly include the statements in further agreements.
- C. CONCESSIONAIRE shall comply with CITY'S approved Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) program submitted in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Office of the Secretary, Part 23, Participation by Minority

- Business Enterprise programs of the Department of Transportation-Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations may be amended.
- D. If CONCESSIONAIRE is an ACDBE firm, evidence of certification as an Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise issued under an Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program approved by the Department of Transportation shall be provided prior to the commencement of this agreement. If CONCESSIONAIRE is eligible for certification as an ACDBE, but is not currently certified, CONCESSIONAIRE shall notify CITY of its eligibility prior to the commencement of this agreement so that the certification process can be initiated.
- E. CONCESSIONAIRE will comply with the CITY'S ACDBE requirements and will provide ACDBE information to City in a form reasonably requested by City on a quarterly basis.
- F. The City will comply with all regulations set forth in 49 CFR Part 23 and will monitor Operators at the Airport for compliance with the ACDBE program.
- G. The city will submit to the Federal Aviation Administration's Regional Civil Rights Office, an annual ACDBE participation report showing the commitments and attainments. The city will take measures to ensure nondiscriminatory participation of ACDBEs in concession, and other covered activities.

To calculate the base of the goal **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** considered the previous 3 years of gross concession receipts and the projected potential concession revenue (gross receipts) three years into the future including upcoming new opportunities.

Management Contract or Subcontract

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will add the dollar amount of a management contract or subcontract with an ACDBE to the total participation by ACDBEs in airport concessions (both the numerator AND the denominator) and to the base from which the airport's percentage goal is calculated. However, the dollar amount of a management contract or subcontract with a non-ACDBE and the gross revenue of business activities to which the management contract or subcontract pertains will not be added to this base in either the numerator or denominator.

The following are not included in the total gross receipts for concessions: (a) the gross receipts of car rental operations, (b) the dollar amount of a management contract or subcontract with a non-ACDBE, (c) the gross receipts of business activities to which a management contract or subcontract with a non-ACDBE pertains, and (d) any portion of a firm's estimated gross receipts that will not be generated from a concession.

If a new concession opportunity arises prior to the end of this goal period and the estimated average of annual gross revenues are anticipated to be \$200,000 or greater, **McAllen International Airport (MFE)** will submit to the FAA an appropriate adjustment to the overall goal. After reviewing our historical data, we determined the median is 0.41% which is our Step 2 adjustment figure.

To arrive at an overall goal, we added our Step 1 base figure with our Step 2 adjustment figure and then averaged the total arriving at an overall goal of 1.00%.

$$0.38 + 0.41 = 0.79 / 2 = 0.395\% = use 0.40\%$$

In order to reflect as accurately as possible, the ACDBE participation we would expect in the absence of discrimination we have adjusted our base figure by 0.60%. Our overall goal for non-car rental concessions is 1.00%.

The data used to determine the adjustment to the base figure was as follows.

There is no historical ACDBE data to reference to make an adjustment to the Step 1 base figure, however, McAllen International Airport (MFE) feels it can achieve a slightly higher ACDBE goal during the 3-year period because additional ACDBE firms are expected to be certified in the market area. Therefore, the McAllen International Airport (MFE) is increasing its Step 1 base figure by 0.60% for a total overall goal of 1.00% for FY-2025-2027.

McAllen International Airport (MFE) believes this adjusted goal figure will accurately reflect ACDBE non-car rental concession participation that can be achieved during this 3-year period.

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A summary of the information these stakeholders provided is as follows:

- The group discussed the updated goal methodology.
- The group discussed the market area and the purpose for selecting the State of Texas.
- The group discussed that the upcoming parking lot management contract has the ACDBE goals included in the solicitation.
- The group discussed the importance of meeting the MFE ACDBE goals.
- The group discussed the types of ACDBE firms that can help meet the goal.
- The group discussed that with such a low goal, there is little incentive for firms to get certified.
- The group discussed the numbers and types of other than rental car ACDBE certified firm that could potentially conduct business or provide goods and services at MFE.
- The group discussed the need to get more (other than rental car) small businesses in the Rio Grande Valley ACDBE certified.

Breakout of Estimated Race-Neutral & Race Conscious participation

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using race-neutral means of facilitating ACDBE participation. The primary measure **MFE** will use to encourage race-neutral participation is the active implementation of our race-neutral small business element that is required by § 23.26. The small business element is detailed in **MFE** FAA-approved ACDBE Program Plan.

We estimate that, in meeting our overall goal of **1.00%**, we will obtain **1.00%** from race-neutral participation and **0%** through race-conscious measures.

In order to ensure that our ACDBE program will be narrowly tailored to overcome the effects of discrimination, if we use concession specific goals we will adjust the estimated breakout of race-neutral and race-conscious participation as needed to reflect actual ACDBE participation and we will track and report race-neutral and race conscious participation separately. In order to reflect as accurately as possible, the ACDBE participation we would expect in the absence of discrimination we have adjusted our base figure by 0.35%. Our overall goal for non-car rental concessions is 1.00%.

There is no historical ACDBE data to reference to make an adjustment to the Step 1 base figure, however, McAllen International Airport (MFE) feels it can achieve a slightly higher ACDBE goal during the 3-year period because additional ACDBE firms are expected to be certified in the market area. Therefore, the McAllen International Airport (MFE) is increasing its Step 1 base figure by 035% for a total overall goal of 1.00% for FY-2025-2027.

A summary of the information these stakeholders provided is as follows:

- The group discussed the updated goal methodology.
- The group discussed the market area and the purpose for selecting the State of Texas.
- The group discussed that the upcoming parking lot management contract has the ACDBE goals included in the solicitation.
- The group discussed the importance of meeting the MFE ACDBE goals.
- The group discussed the types of ACDBE firms that can help meet the goal.
- The group discussed that with such a low goal, there is little incentive for firms to get certified.
- The group discussed the numbers and types of rental car ACDBE certified firm that could potentially conduct business or provide goods and services at MFE.
- The group discussed the need to get more (rental car) small businesses in the Rio Grande Valley, ACDBE certified.

Breakout of Estimated Race-Neutral & Race Conscious participation

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will meet the maximum feasible portion of its overall goal by using race-neutral means of facilitating ACDBE participation. The primary measure **MFE** will use to encourage race-neutral participation is the active implementation of our race-neutral small business element that is required by § 23.26. The small business element is detailed in **MFE** FAA-approved ACDBE Program Plan.

We estimate that, in meeting our overall goal of **1.00%**, we will obtain **1.00%** from race-neutral participation and **0%** through race-conscious measures.

The McAllen International Airport (MFE) has consistently enacted comprehensive outreach efforts targeting minority and disadvantaged communities to educate and create awareness of opportunities and encourage certification in those trades that commonly do business with the DOT and aviation communities.

In order to ensure that our ACDBE program will be narrowly tailored to overcome the effects of discrimination, if we use concession specific goals we will adjust the estimated breakout of race-neutral and race-conscious participation as needed to reflect actual ACDBE participation and we will track and report race-neutral and race conscious participation separately. For reporting purposes, race-neutral ACDBE participation includes, but is not limited to, the following: ACDBE participation through a prime contract that an ACDBE obtains through customary competitive procurement procedures; ACDBE participation in a concession opportunity that does not have an ACDBE goal; ACDBE participation that exceeds a concession specific goal; and ACDBE participation through a subcontract from a prime contractor that did not consider a firm's ACDBE status in making the award.

We will maintain data separately on ACDBE achievements in those contracts with and without concession specific goals and report accordingly.

Small Business Element

1. Objective/Strategies

- (1) McAllen International Airport (MFE) will consider the concession opportunities available through all types of concession models.
- (2) McAllen International Airport (MFE) will consider concession contracting approaches to facilitate the ability of small businesses, including ACDBEs, to compete for and obtain direct leasing opportunities.

2. Definition

- ACDBE firms should be identified as eligible for participation in the small business element.
- Texas small business size standard will be consistent with 49 CFR § 23.33.
- Personal Net Worth standards should be consistent with 49 CFR Part 23 thresholds.
- All businesses meeting the criteria outlined in this element will be considered to be small businesses, without regard to race or gender.

3. Verification

McAllen International Airport (MFE) will diligently attempt to minimize fraud and abuse in the small business element of its ACDBE program by verifying the program eligibility of firms. The verification procedure will ensure the participation of all eligible small businesses. Additionally, McAllen International Airport (MFE) may use other local and state certification programs or other programs that include race/gender/geographical considerations as conditions of the certification, as needed, to comply with the race-neutral requirements of §23.26. This multi-faceted approach ensures the integrity of the program while fostering a diverse and inclusive environment for all small businesses.

Monitoring/Record Keeping

- McAllen International Airport (MFE) will track and monitor participation by ACDBEs and other small businesses that results from the implementation of this small business element. Participation will be reported annually as part of the Uniform Report of ACDBE Participation.
- McAllen International Airport (MFE) will revise the existing tracking forms to increase
 accuracy in reporting and the monitoring process to regularly assess the effectiveness of
 the small business element, ensuring it meets its objectives and identifying any necessary
 revisions to comply with 49 CFR Part 23.

Assurances

- Certified ACDBEs that meet the size criteria established under this element are presumptively eligible to participate therein element;
- There are no geographic preferences or limitations imposed on any concession opportunities included in this small business element;
- There are no limits on the number of concession opportunities awarded to firms participating in this element but every effort will be made to avoid creating barriers to the use of new, emerging, or untried businesses;
- **MFE** will take proactive steps to encourage those minority and women owned firms that are eligible for ACDBE certification to become certified; and
- This element is open to small businesses regardless of their location. There is no local or other geographic preference as part of this small business element.
